



Extended call for applications for the "Johannsen Bioeconomy Award 2025"

We are pleased to announce the 'Johannsen Bioeconomy Award', sponsored by Honorary Senator Marion Johannsen for outstanding Master's theses in the field of bioeconomy, for the year 2025. The award is intended to honour students whose Master's theses have a made a significant contribution to development in the **field of the bioeconomy** or one of its subtopics. The emphasis is primarily on topics that focus on the **international** perspective and cooperation in the bioeconomy.

The prize is endowed with **1,000 euros**.

Master's students from all Hohenheim faculties who will have completed their Master's thesis by the end of June 2025 can apply for the prize. They must be able to convincingly demonstrate the contribution of their planned Master's thesis to the bioeconomy.

Please submit the following documents in PDF format by email to Ms. Braun, Rector's Office, email: barbara.braun@verwaltung.uni-hohenheim.de, **latest** by **Thursday, 17 April 2025**.

- A summary of the Master's thesis of up to four pages
- A one-page description of the thematic relevance to the bioeconomy and, if applicable, the international dimension
- A written declaration of consent from the first supervisor for submission of the application
- CV of the student submitting the application

After the submission deadline, the award committee, consisting of the sponsor and a professor from each of the three faculties, will decide on the recipients of the award.

The award ceremony will take place during the Dies academicus 2025.

By applying for the award, applicants give their consent for the University of Hohenheim to use their name, the title of their thesis and, if applicable, a photo of the award ceremony for public relations purposes.
